1. Minutes of the AGM 28.11.12 and Directors' meeting 4.11.13

It was agreed that HUG will offer wine and light refreshments at the forthcoming AGM, to give it a more social atmosphere.

3. Reports

4. Accounts

It was agreed that the accounts should be broken down to show the different individual funds held and administered by HUG, because the current global figure of over £7000 shown as held by HUG in its accounts has prevented the library garden from receiving additional funds for its construction. Mark has the breakdown, and will pass it to Pepe to insert into the accounts for general circulation.

5. Library garden

David Williams put forward his view that HUG should underwrite the £1500 cost of constructing the library garden if it is not successful in its bid for funding from Community First - Mary indicated that she could also apply for Heathrow Community funding. It was agreed that once the HUG accounts are clearly broken down, it may be possible to reapply for Civic Pride funding.

6. Ham and Petersham Community magazine

The magazine will be re-launched in the new year, and Sarah Perret has put in a grant application for £500 to cover start-up costs. All community groups etc which will be publishing in it will be asked to pay £500 pa to cover on-going costs. The 1st draft copy should be with Sarah early January.

7. Suggestions for future meetings

- Walk in Richmond Park combined with tour of Pembroke Lodge

8. AOB

Andres is working on a possible new project for Makerspace: evening board games at Ham Youth centre, such as Warhammer. Funding for a game could come from Civic pride, or possibly a contribution from HUG
